A Change of the Guard by Dan Frei, Board Chair

I'd like to thank Vonda McFadden for her excellent leadership as board president these past 3 years. As I relieve her of that role, I can only pray that I can lead with the grace and calm that she showed throughout her tenure.

My involvement with Family Promise began in October 2016 when National Associate Tom Cioffi came to our community in an effort to increase the number of affiliates across the country. At that time, they had just surpassed 200 affiliates in 42 states. Washington state had 2 locations – one in Mt. Vernon and one in Spokane. (At this time there are 4 additional locations - Spanaway, Vancouver, Aberdeen and Kelso).

Tom presented at several of our local churches and offered a compelling program that was met with enthusiasm. I joined a core team of 4 and began the work to bring this program to our community. It took nearly 2 years to register with the state and the federal government as a non-profit, get the commitment of several local churches, find a location in which we could begin operations, hire an executive director, etc.

We were able to begin offering help to families in late 2019, but had only op-

erated for about a year before the Covid-19 epidemic caused us to restructure as a static shelter. In many ways I feel we have only now begun to get our feet on the ground. So much has happened in the last few years that I feel there is a need to communicate our existence with several of the churches as well as the larger population.

My involvement with Family Promise has allowed me to meet so many wonderful people in our community. I find that I am often in awe of their faith. While I so often feel the need to "make it happen", they have expressed a trust in God – that by doing their part, He will make their efforts fruitful.

I'm excited for the future of Family Promise of Cowlitz County. We have an executive director (Sara Wallace) with a passion to help families facing homelessness, an office manager (Jamie Craig) who has been with us from the beginning and board members with an array of perspectives and talents that support this wonderful organization.

As we near the end of what has been our 5th year of operation, I want to thank you for your continued support and prayers. This program is working and has helped so many in our community to achieve safe and permanent housing for their families. As we continue this important work, please consider us in your year-end giving.

Focus on Homlessness Prevention by Sara Wallace, Executive Director

Dearest Friends,

As we welcome the feel of a warm fire and family gatherings, good food and laughter, let us be grateful for our family, our health and our home. Our goal is to ensure every child has a

home. Because of your faith in us, Family Promise of Cowlitz County was able to shelter 14 families with 36 children this year. Twelve of these families successfully graduated with 31 children moving into permanent, stable housing. Thank you for trusting our vision.

Preventing homelessness from even occurring has been a key focus, and with community support, in 2024 alone, we were part of preventing an incredible 43 families with 99 children from experiencing the trauma associated with becoming homeless. THANK YOU.

Childhood homelessness is an invisible crisis; these children look just like our children or our grandchildren. They were not part of the situation that forced them out of a home. Yet, the systemic circumstances that parents face (poverty, substance use, lack of affordable housing, mental health issues, domestic violence) create generational trauma that is passed down, hindering children from achieving their full potential.

Based on statistics from the National Alliance to End Homelessness, children experiencing homelessness:

- Are more likely to repeat a grade (Washington doesn't allow this anymore, so they fall behind)
- Have lower academic performance
- Are more likely to be expelled or drop out
- Have higher risk of health problems
- Have higher risk of mental and behavioral problems

Imagine eliminating this and giving them a chance to have their education at the same level as their peers!

Thanks to your generosity, hundreds of individuals have received shelter, meals, hotel stays, and other supportive services in the past year through our programs of shelter, prevention/diversion and stabilization. With your help, we are working with families to help them regain stability and get back into their own home. For that, we thank you!

But there are still many more families in our community who need help. We've seen families finding it difficult to obtain affordable housing and struggling to pay rent. We receive 4 to 12 calls like this per day, on average. Because of these needs, we are focusing our growth and services on providing resources further upstream to help families *before* they face losing their homes. Our goal in this process is to break the cycle of poverty and instability that has impacted so many families in the Cowlitz County and SW Washington area.

With so few resources available for these vulnerable families, we need your help. We are currently looking for more church partnerships and monthly donations, in-kind donations and volunteers. At FPCC we teach family selfsufficiency with a community-based approach. No family is alone, no child left behind.

A great way to spread awareness on behalf of these families is to share this letter with your congregation! Ask them to add it to their bulletin or tell a neighbor or associate about us. Tell them about all the children we (with your help) have been able to serve! Together we can do so much more!

Thank you, thank you on behalf of the little boys and girls who walk the halls of this shelter, happy, fed and loved! Thank you!


A SUCCESS Story by Hilary, a Family Promise Graduate

I was part of a program through the Kelso Housing Authority called Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS). My goals were to become a Substance Use Disorder (SUD) counselor and to own my own home. Currently I am in school and working towards a bachelor's in social work.

Last January I accepted a promotion as a Substance Use Disorder Professional Trainee (SUDPT), which is just a fancy way of saying a counselor in training. This license allows me to practice and train as a counselor. This included a raise which took me out of the low-income bracket so I ended up graduating from the FSS early, but they gave me a check of \$18,000 to put towards a home or whatever I would like. I am currently on the search for a home but haven't found one yet.



My oldest, Corbin, moved to Wyoming and works as a manager of a family dollar store. He started as a general staff member and worked his way up the corporate ladder and now he is a salaried employee. They even gave him a moving package as part of the promotion to go and run a store that was not doing so well to get it back up and running. Once he is done there and has



all the staff trained he will move on to the next store and do the same. I am super proud of him.

Jeniah is also doing great things. She is currently working as a CNA and in-home care provider. She will soon be exploring options to become a medical assistant. She owns her own car, pays her own insurance, and is becoming a grown young adult woman. I am super proud of her as well.

Wisdom is amazing as ever. Tallest one in his class. Sweet kind and funny as ever. He is in the first grade, making lots of friends and thriving. He's joining a basketball team in January and maybe a self-defense class of some sort when that is over.

My journey began at Family Promise. I wouldn't be where I am today without the love and support from all the members of the congregations, volunteers and staff. Thank you, FPCC.
