Day of Caring 2025

The 2025 Day of Caring hosted by the United Way of Cowlitz County was in full force this year on September 11th, with many gathering for one purpose: to make an impact!

The United Way staff graciously partnered Family Promise to provide a crew that was so perfectly made for our needs, a true product of today's goal! Weyerhaeuser! This crew came ready, willing and more than able to help us with not 1 but 3 projects!

In the wake of our very first graduate, Hilary, purchasing her very first home, we had an idea!

Purchasing a home can be overwhelming with landscaping, painting, repairs, etc. Having the knowledge to navigate the process of maintenance can be so valuable.

We planned a team to help Hilary get some of these needs filled! The crew came with chainsaws, a trailer, paint brushes and good attitudes! There were community members at every end of the yard, even on the roof! As I walked around thanking everyone, I had chills on my arms and tears in my eyes! Each person had a smile on their face and the willingness to give all their effort into whatever it was they were doing. I felt bonded as a group that day. It truly was God's work in motion.

We had a second group at the shelter building working on some furniture that was needed and scrubbing our bathrooms, kitchen, laundry and bathtub for our families. The Shelter has a new sparkle. Cleaning is never anybody's favorite job, but they did it with a smile!

For quite some time now, Family Promise has been graciously given storage space in a warehouse, owned by one of our supporters, Boyd Burns and his wife Deborah. This space has been graciously donated to us year after year. We utilize the space to keep furniture, household items, beds, and other applianc-

es for our families who may need it when they graduate into or move from shelter to their new home. We had been given donations over the last year and haven't had the capacity to organize recent donations. And it was a heap! Jamie Craig, our office manager, headed the team at the storage facility.

Along with the warehouse team, they donated storage bins and shelving to make it more accessible and convenient. It turned out beautiful.
