Our Newest Graduate Family!

We would like to congratulate Jessica and her daughter Jasmine, and the newest addition to their family Zack! No, not a baby, but stepdad to Jasmine and Husband to Jessica!

Jessica and Jasmine entered Shelter just a few months ago. Jessica's partner Zack is in the military and is stationed on base. Jessica and her nine-month-old baby girl Jasmine came to stay in our program, and since entering Shelter, Jessica has grown beyond words. Jessica worked on self-reflection. She became Motivated and proud of herself. We witnessed a wonderful transformation. Jessica has been struggling most of



her life. She has two children who are not in her care but has shared custody. The boys spent the summer with us in Shelter and it was quite a treat. Baby Jasmine is the happiest baby ever and so beautiful.

In just a few short months, Jessica has gained employment, and was approved for her own apartment. She and Zack signed the lease and recently moved in. Just after moving, on September 19th at 7 AM they were married at the Kelso United Methodist Presbyterian Church.



Congratulations, Jessica and Zack, on your new family, on your new home and your journey ahead. Family Promise of Cowlitz County is proud of Jessica as an individual, for her progress as a mother and now as a wife.

Jessica plans to go back to school and Zach is heading to Japan for a military assignment.

Beyond Shelter

One of our dearest graduates from this past year has been constantly on our hearts. We watched her life transform with the love that she found for God and her son's newfound relationship with their higher power.

Heather transferred to FPCC from another shelter. Some of the traumas that are associated with homelessness were really causing her to struggle internally, keeping her from realizing her full potential. She was a hard-working smart mom, but there was something missing.

Sundays around the Family Center were loud, both upstairs and downstairs, from two active congregations. She and her children began to hear worship on Sunday morning, and it called to them. They began attending church on Sundays. I saw a miracle happen with his family. Jesus Christ delivered his message, and this family received his blessings! Heather's relationship with her sons blossomed. She gained full-time employment, continued her mental health services and dove deeply into her faith. She was an exceptional mom from day one, but there was new light around them when they found their faith. They were able to graduate into permanent housing and six months later they upgraded to a bigger home. Heather is working, independently supporting her sons. She's involved with her church, serving the community and giving back to Family Promise. Her kids go to a faith based private school, and have learned that God's love is unconditional. I've attached a message that Heather sent us from a follow up visit:

"Everything is really great actually. Ya know aside from faith, church is allowing us to be knitted into the community. I love my job, absolutely love being able to meet people and be able to just pour into them. So that's also given me a chance to know more people. At some point in the day there is always a prayer of gratefulness of everything we have. Meeting you and having your program was so humbling because you made sure we had everything we needed. For me to be able to have a home with all of the things that go with it still just brings me to tears. You run an amazing program that really took care of us. With so much love, girl! I am looking forward to what this next season has in store for us and would love to have opportunities to be a part of more things. I really just appreciate where we are in life and I'm so, so, so thankful."

All in the Timing

We have dozens of calls per week looking for Shelter, housing, utility funding, a shoulder to cry on or an ear to listen. I have a story to share that keeps us fighting for these families and provides some insight about how outside shelter case management works.

We received call from Dad with three girls in middle school. He had just separated from his two-year relationship and was needing Shelter. He made a good income. He had amazing credit and finances were in order. When you separate from a partner it can mean emergency relocation. Life changes in an instant and did it ever! As I welcomed him into my office to interview for the shelter, he seemed defeated, and very, very tired. He was on the hunt to find a place for his girls. As the interview progressed and as he told me his story, he shared that the mother of his three daughters passed away some years ago. He was all that they had. He sat in front of me feeling hopeless, and really felt like he failed these girls. I assured him we would find an answer, and that with this community and our support, his family would be settling into a safe stable environment very soon. I approved them for our program and begin working to find housing.

Meanwhile, earlier in the week, I was given a list of a few vacant local units, so we quickly applied for one that fit his family. Miracles do happen. By morning, he applied and was approved for a home big enough for the girls to each have their own room. He came back into the shelter to meet me and go over details. He was so grateful and humbled by our chance meeting.

He thanked me and I could feel his "thank you" from the heart. It gave me chills.

He signed a lease shortly after, and through resources in our Promise of Home Prevention program FPCC was able to be part of this family's journey around homelessness. They now had a fresh start as a family of four. This picture in front of me of defeat quickly turn to Hope and gratefulness. Congratulations Dad! Family Promise of Cowlitz County is right behind you!
