2022 At A Glance

Family Promise of Cowlitz County services covered 6 program areas:

- Sanctuary program at the Family Center, including housing, meals and Case Management
- **Stabilization** program, post-graduation extended Case Management, financial and life skills development
- Prevention services including landlord mediation and housing location
- Diversion programs such as rental assistance and general housing location
- Outreach including such things as a food pantry, clothing closet and holiday gift program
- **Referrals** which put people in contact with other agencies or organizations without directly proving FPCC services or Case Management




